REDISTRICTING

Every ten years after the U.S. Census is completed, districts are redrawn using the updated data. Redistricting is the process of drawing electoral district boundaries, which then determine what neighborhoods and communities are grouped together. For most elected officials, voters in each district elect representatives from those districts. Incumbents and candidates running for office may be required to live in the district they represent, and due to boundary line changes, may no longer reside in those districts.

POSSIBLE CHANGES TO HOW CANDIDATES ARE ELECTED

Some local districts have transitioned from at-large elections to division or areabased elections. For more information, please refer to the Positions Up for Election on our website at www.elections.saccounty.gov.

TOP TWO PRIMARY

All candidates for voter-nominated offices are listed on the primary ballot.

Only the top two candidates that receive the highest votes in the primary election – regardless of party preference – move on to the general election.



BEFORE THE NOMINATION PERIOD

What Do I Need To Know Before I File?



- Candidates may designate a representative to pick up – and/or – file nomination documents on their behalf. The designated representative must provide a letter of authorization, signed by the candidate, when picking up the forms.
- A Letter of Authorization form can be found on our website and must be properly completed and signed prior to either obtaining or filing the nomination papers for a candidate.
- The filed Letter of Authorization shall be retained by the elections official.

JUDICIAL CANDIDATE CHECKLIST

- Voter Registration Verification Form: Superior Court Judicial Incumbents who have provided their residential address by completing the Verification Form will not be required to provide a residential address on all candidacy forms. The residential address will be marked as "verified".
- ➤ <u>Declaration of Intent Form</u>: All candidates for judicial office *are required* to file a Declaration of Intention to become a candidate. Elections Code § 8023
- Declaration of Qualifications Form: Declaration under penalty of perjury that the candidate is qualified to run for the office they are seeking. Elections Code § 13.5
- ➤ <u>Filing Fee/Cost</u>: The filing fee for Superior Court Judge judicial candidates represents 1% of the annual salary is due at the time that the Declaration of Intent is filed. Please make checks payable to the County of Sacramento. Elections Code §§ 8104(b), 8105(b)
- Nomination Forms: The required nomination paperwork may be obtained in our office during the nomination period and must be returned by the end of the nomination period.
- Declaration of Candidacy and Ballot Designation Worksheet: These forms must be filed during the nomination period in order to become a candidate. Elections Code §§ 8020, 8028, 8040, 13107.3

SIGNATURE IN-LIEU PETITIONS (optional)

- During this period, petition forms may be obtained form our office to secure signatures in lieu of all or a portion of the filing fee.
- Signatures submitted on the in-lieu petitions may also be applied to the signature requirements for offices on the nominating petition.
- Candidates running for offices that require a filing fee may submit Signatures in-Lieu of Filing Fee Petitions no later than 5:00 p.m. on November 8, 2023 (E-118).
- Valid signatures will be applied to the nomination petition signature requirement. However, Signatures In-Lieu of petition forms cannot be substituted for purposes of filing nomination petitions unless you have met the nomination signature requirement.


Candidates may circulate their own petitions.

SIGNER QUALIFICATIONS – Must be a registered voter and resident of the specific election area (i.e., jurisdiction, district, political subdivision) at the time of signing.

EACH SIGNER must print and sign their own name and include residence address.

P.O. Box numbers or mailing addresses are NOT acceptable.

SIGNATURES IN-LIEU OF FILING FEE FORM

Circulator qualifications

Candidates may circulate their own petitions.

Circulators **must** be 18 years of age or older.

Circulators are not required to be a registered voter, or to be affiliated with the same party as the candidate.

Circulators **must** complete the affidavit of circulator in their own handwriting. **Do not type.**

To complete the affidavit of circulator, the circulator must:

- Print their name
- Fill in the address portion
- Fill in the dates when the petition was circulated
- Sign and date

All fees are non-refundable and must be paid by check or money order only.



CANDIDATE RECEIPT AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT FORM

- Completed by both the candidate and the elections official.
- Serves as an acknowledgement of what was issued and received.
- Must be signed in the presence of an elections official.



All candidates who are issued nomination papers will be required to acknowledge that all original, signed nomination documents are due in our office on December 8, 2023 by 5 pm.

It is your responsibility as a candidate to ensure that you have met the requirements and filed all nomination documents by the deadline.



NOMINATION PETITIONS

Candidates for office may be required to file nomination petitions with a required number of valid signatures for the office.

SIGNER QUALIFICATIONS

Signers must be registered voters within the district

Signers must print and sign their own name



NOMINATION PETITION CIRCULATOR


INSTRUCTIONS

Circulator will print their name, address and dates that the petition was circulated.

Circulator's signature is required.

WHAT IS IT?

The purpose of the Ballot Designation Worksheet is for candidates to justify the use of their proposed ballot designation.

The ballot designation is the word – or group of words – that will appear on the ballot under the candidate's name, designating the candidate's principal profession, vocation, or occupation.



(Elections Code §§ 13107, 13107.3, 13107.5; California Code of Regulations § 20711)

WHAT CAN I USE AS MY BALLOT DESIGNATION?


- Elective Office: Words that designate the elective office which the candidate holds at the time of filing the nomination documents.
- **2. Incumbent**: The word "incumbent" may be used if the candidate is running for the same office that they hold at the time of filing the nomination papers.
- **3. 3-word Profession/Vocation/Occupation**: No more than three words designating either **the** *current* **principal professions, vocations, or occupations of the candidate.** If more than one profession, vocation or occupation is listed, it shall be separated by a slash ("/").
- **4. Appointed Incumbent**: The phrase "Appointed Incumbent" may be used if the candidate holds an office by virtue of appointment, and the candidate is running for the same office.

A justification is additional information about why you are proposing the use of the ballot designation. This includes a brief description of your duties as well as the name of your employer, business and a contact who can verify the information is correct and may include a family member.

Note: Comments such as "I work here" or "I've been doing this for 20 years" are unacceptable.






CANDIDATE STATEMENT FORM

- All candidates must complete the coversheet even if they are not planning to file a candidate statement in the County Voter Information Guide.
- The statement must be type written.
- We recommend using the Candidate Statement fillable form available on our website.



- The statement must meet the word count requirement.
- Review your candidate statement for spelling and grammar before filing. Once submitted, it cannot be changed.

CODE OF FAIR CAMPAIGN PRACTICES

INSTRUCTIONS

- ✓ This is an optional form and states that you plan to run a fair campaign and honest campaign.
- California legislation has passed recommendations on how candidates should run a fair campaign

There are basic principles of decency, honesty, and fair play which every candidate for public office in the State of California has a moral obligation to observe and uphold in order that, after vigorously contested but fairly conducted campaigns, our citizens may exercise their constitutional right to a free and untrammeted choice and the will of the people may be fully and clearly excressed on the issues.

THEREFORE:

- (1) I SHALL CONDUCT my campaign openly and publicly, discussing the issues as I see them, presenting my record and policies with sincerity and frankness, and criticizing without fear or favor the record and policies of my opponents or political parties that merit his criticism.
- (2) I SHALL NOT USE OR PERMIT the use of character defamation, whispering campaigns, libel, stander, or scurrilous attacks on any candidate or his or her personal or family life.
- (3) I SHALL NOT USE CR PERMIT any appeal to negative prejudice based on a candidate's actual or perceived race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, marital status, age, sexual orientation, sex, including gender identify, or any other characteristic set forth in Section 12940 of the Government Code, or association with another person who has any of the actual or perceived characteristics set forth in Section 12940 of the Government Code.
- (4) I SHALL NOT USE OR PERMIT any dishonest or unethical practice that tends to corrupt or undermine our American system of free elections, or that hampers or prevents the full and free expression of the will of the voters including acts intended to hinder or prevent any eligible person from readstering to vote. enrolling to vote, or voting.
- (5) I SHALL NOT coerce election help or campaign contributions for myself or for any other candidate from my employees.
- (6) I SHALL IMMEDIATELY AND PUBLICLY REPUDIATE support deriving from any individual or group that resorts, on behalf of my candidacy or in opposition to that of my opponent, to the methods and factics that I condemn. I shall accept responsibility to take firm action against any subordinate who violates any provision of this code or the laws governing elections.
- (7) I SHALL DEFEND AND UPHOLD the right of every qualified American voter to full and equal participation in the electoral process.

I, the undersigned, candidate for election to public office in the State of California or treasurer or chairperson of a committee making any independent expenditures, hereby voluntarily endorse, subscribe to, and solemnly pledge myself to conduct my campain in accordance with the above principles and practices.



The Write-in Period will run from January 8, 2024 (E-57) to February 20, 2024 (E-14).

Candidates who want to run as a write-in must first file a Statement of Write-in Candidacy Form with the county elections office.

- Some offices require nomination signatures to be collected for a valid write-in candidacy. Signers
 of nomination petitions for write-in candidates must be registered voters within the district or
 political subdivision in which the candidate is filing.
- No filing fee is required of a write-in candidate.

There will be no write-in period during the general election for voter-nominated offices.


If a write-in candidate in the primary election is one of the top-two candidates, their name will appear on the ballot in the general election.

Only votes cast for qualified write-in candidates will be reported.
